APRIL 9, 2009

After serving as the voice and legal newspaper of McPherson County for 120 years, *The Tryon Graphic* would merge with *The Stapleton Enterprise*, effective April 16, 2009. The paper was founded in 1889 as the *McPherson County News*. The name was later changed to *The Tryon Graphic* and it was the oldest business in McPherson County still in operation. Tryon was the smallest town in the state of Nebraska to still have a legal newspaper.
