



Brianna played in 70

sets her high school career with the Lady Longhorns. She averaged 3.9 assists per set with a total of 273 career assists. She had 42 ace serves and 27 kills. She has had 169 digs as a Longhorn.

"I am very happy and proud of Brianna," stated Coach Melvin. "She has worked incredibly hard to get to where she is. Brianna sustained a knee in-

Students from 29 area high schools put their skills and knowledge to the test during the 50th annual Inter-High Scholastic Contest at North Platte Community College on Wednesday.

More than 230 applied technology tests were taken on North Campus and a record 800-plus academic tests were taken on South Campus. Kelly Rippen, the college's area dean of enrollment management, said the event

just continues to grow every year.

The applied technology competitions consisted of both written test and hands-on elements. Students were judged in the areas of auto body, automotive/diesel, building construction, electrical, welding and heating, ventilation and air conditioning.

Winners in the applied technology categories received scholarships and tuition vouchers, and took home equipment that applied to their particular test areas.

Schools were also able to qualify for a scholarship by having any of their students place in the top three.

Kyon Neal, a senior at McPherson County High School placed third in Welding Division 2. Max Diederich and Sean Anderson both of Southwest High School were first and second respectively.


