

Each eligible customer's cash-back dividend is based on the average loan volume during the calendar year. The more eligible loan business customers have with the cooperative, the more they benefit financially through cash-back dividends.

The FCSAmerica Board of Directors approves each year's cash-back distribution in December based on a number of factors, including the cooperative's financial performance. During the 13 years that FCSAmerica has distributed cash-back

dividends, net income has grown to \$510 million from \$294 million and members' equity has increased to \$4.7 billion from \$1.5 billion.
