King Arthur Flour Boosts Youth Programming

The Area Nebraska Extension program received a generous donation when two pallets of whole wheat flour were delivered to the Extension office in Ord last week. The flour, which was processed and donated by King Arthur Flour, will be packed into kits for youth who register for a summer cooking club, entitled, "Let's Bake and Create Cooking Club". The youth will practice making nutritious whole-wheat bread, pancakes, muffins and pizza crust. King Arthur Flour also provided recipe booklets, packets of yeast and bench scrapers to include in the kits.

Extension Educators

Brenda Aufdenkamp and Kayla Hinrichs are working to create this self-paced youth club to help 3rd through 8th grade students increase their baking proficiency. As a result, the flour will be distributed in a 17 county region in Central and Western Nebraska.

Throughout the month of June, youth who register will receive weekly kits containing flour, a recipe, printed educational games, activities and internet links to connect them to online tutorials. Recipes include: yeast bread, pizza, muffins, pancakes. While not the same as face-to-face meetings, the kits

have proved a popular way to stay in touch and help youth build new skills.

Thanks to King Arthur Flour for letting local Nebraska Rural Youth "Bake for Good." Any extra bags of flour will be given to the food pantry to share with community members.
