

Husker Meats hosted the first Steers for Students pilot program at their facility in Ainsworth, NE on Wednesday, June 29th. Steers for Students is an educational program geared for the youth of the Sandhills. This pro-

gram will allow students an educational opportunity to evaluate and grade carcasses of locally grown beef, observe how a packing plant operates and supply their own schools with delicious Sandhills beef.

Educators involved in the program included Nicolas Herrera, UNL grad student, who pro-

vided data to help inform the students and others on the science behind carcass evaluation and grading.

Adam Wegner from the Nebraska Beef Council provided insight on how consumer demand might reflect on the cattle pro-
