NOVEMBER 15, 2012

NOVEMBER 14, 2002

McPherson County voters went to the polls on November 5. There was no opposition in the local county races and incumbents were re-elected. They were County Clerk, Judy Dailey; County Treasurer, Shareen Munson; County Sheriff, James M. Scott and County Commissioners, R. Edward Sowders and Donald E. Moore.

The Hastings College Forensics team split up and competed in two tournaments November 2-3. Jeremy Arensdorf of Tryon placed fifth in duo interpretation and sixth in dramatic interpretations. He competed at the Jackrabbit Joust.

SEVENTY YEARS AGO
NOVEMBER 20, 1952

Gaylord Wright, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy D. Wright, and Jim Doyle, son of Mr. and Mrs. D.T. Doyle of Tryon, enlisted in the U.S. Navy for four years and were transferred to the Navy Training Center at San Diego, California. Earl Stoddard, son of Mr. and Mrs. A.T. Stoddard, enlisted for three years in the U.S. Army. Francis (Frank) Hora and Forrest Kugler Jr. enlisted in the Air Force for four years and will have 12 weeks of basics at Par AFB before being sent to a technical school. Army Cpl Nathan H. Lutes, son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Lutes of Stapleton, will soon be released from active duty from the Army. Lutes entered the Army in November of 1950. (These enlistments

took place during the Korean War.)

EIGHTY YEARS AGO
NOVEMBER 19, 1942

Registrations are being made at the grade school building this afternoon and tomorrow for gasoline ration books. The teachers will register District No. 4 car owners from 2:30 to 5:00 M.W.T.

Ellis Jones, U.S. Navy, was expected to arrive in North Platte last night for a visit with his mother, Mrs. Alice Jones, and his brother, Henry and family.

Roger Shimmin who recently joined the army, going from Hooker County, is now stationed at Camp Adair, Oregon. Incidentally, this is the camp which Sgt. Victor Masters is stationed.

Another McPherson County boy to enter the Service is Robert Shimmin, son of Bobby Shimmin of north Tryon, community. Robert is now stationed at Camp Clairborne, Louisiana. (These are just a few of the men who were in the service from this area during World War II.)

NINETY YEARS AGO
NOVEMBER 17, 1932

McPherson County highways, though they are not as good as others in the state, have made it possible for McPherson County stockmen to now ship direct to Omaha markets by truck. Last Sunday, a huge stock truck came into the county to haul out a load of calves to a feeder at Lexington. The driver had intended to go to the Seeb Smith farm north of Tryon, but was unable to get his machine over the Russell Hill. The calves were loaded into smaller trucks and brought here where they were loaded
