



Two vehicle accident at intersection

Logan County Sheriff Sean Carson and Stapleton Fire & Rescue were called to the scene of a two-vehicle accident at the intersection of Highway 83 and 92 east of Stapleton at approximately 3:50 p.m., Monday, February 6.

Bobbi Scott of Thedford, was driving a white 2004 Cadillac Escalade and was southbound on Highway 83 when she struck the driver's side of a red 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe driven by LeAnne Coleman of Merna.

The Coleman vehicle went through the Nebraska Department of Roads fence and the Scott vehicle landed on its side in the ditch east of the intersection.

Coleman was taken to Great Plains Health in North Platte by Stapleton EMS for unknown injuries.

Two toddlers in the Scott vehicle were not injured. Seat restraints were in use.

Both vehicles were a total loss.

The Logan County Sheriff's office is investigating the accident.

Stapleton Fire & Rescue and the Logan County Sheriff were called out to another accident at the intersection of Highway 83 and 92 east of Stapleton. The intersection has been the scene of numerous accidents over the years. As shown in this photo, the Chevrolet Tahoe was shoved through the fence of the Nebraska Department of Roads property and the Escalade ended on its side on the ditch on the Gandy spur. Sheriff Carson said he is working to get flashing lights installed on the stop sign and rumble strips to make people more aware before pulling out onto Highway 83.

Dog limit in Village will be enforced

The Village of Stapleton Board of Trustees advises residents living within the village limits there is a two dog limit and no dogs can be running at large. Ordinance No. 213-18-1 went into effect July 14, 2021, and will be enforced.

Section 5 of the ordinance reads "It shall be unlawful for any person to own, keep or harbor more than two (2) dogs at any one time or own, keep or harbor any dogs for the purpose of breeding, raising for sale or operating a kennel for the purpose of breeding, raising or providing services for dog sitting within the Village limits."

Section 4 of the ordinance reads "Any dog found running at large,

within the Village limits, shall be seized by the Village marshal or such other person designated by the Chairman and Village Board of Trustees, and shall be held in the Village animal shelter, or such other place approved by the Chairman and Village Board of Trustees, and disposed of or destroyed by the Village marshal, or such other person designated by the Chairman and Village Board of Trustees, after a period of five (5) days have elapsed and the owner has failed, neglected or refused to claim the same and purchase a dog tag, as hereinafter provided."

All dogs must be licensed with the Village

Clerk and the license receipt retained. For each male or barren female dog, the amount is \$10.00 and for each unsprayed female dog, the sum due is \$15.00. As required by NE State Statute 71-4402, every domestic dog must be vaccinated against rabies with a licensed vaccine and revaccinated as required. All dogs licensed within the Village of Stapleton must have proof of a current rabies vaccination that was provided by a licensed veterinarian.

Any person found guilty of violating any portion of the ordinance will be fined in an amount of not less than \$100.00 or more than \$500.00, plus court costs per offense.
