Neighbors had the fire under control when the truck got there so only four or five acres burned.

Quilt Of Valor Presentation

The Quilts of Valor Foundation began in 2003 with a dream, literally a dream. Founder Catherine Roberts' son, Nat, was deployed in Iraq.

"The dream was as vivid as real life," Catherine said. "I saw a young man sitting on the side of his bed in the middle of the night, hunched over. The permeating feeling was one of utter despair. I could see his war demons clustered around, drag-

ging him down into an emotional gutter. Then, as if viewing a movie, I saw him in the next scene wrapped in a quilt. His whole demeanor changed from one of despair to one of hope and well-being. The quilt had made this dramatic change. The message of my dream was: Quilts = Healing."

Jacque Trumbull also

presented Munson with a Liberty Pinwheel quilt, hand pieced and quilted by her mother, Grace Trumbull, during WWII. The bias-cut pieces were in a fabric bundle. None of the other women wanted them so Grace took them and created this quilt. It is fitting for Darrel to receive this family heirloom quilt.
