It was a good opportunity to vaccinate pets and license dogs that are within the Village of Stapleton limits. Village clerk Stacey Anderson said

sixty dog owners took advantage of the clinic and 45 dogs were licensed.

Village residents are reminded current fees for licensing as of June 1 is \$10.00 for male dogs; \$15.00 for female dogs; and spayed female dogs, \$10.00 each. Fees after July 1 are \$20.00 each for male dogs; \$30.00 each for female dogs; and \$20.00 each for spayed female dogs.

A variety of music instruments, a beautiful June evening, and green grass on the Logan County Courthouse lawn, combined to make an enjoyable evening as speaker and musician David Marsh presented "Music From Around the World, Tuesday, June 13. Humanities Nebraska, the Nebraska Cultural Endowment, and the Logan County Library, as part of the HN Speakers Bureau, made the presentation possible.

Marsh, an experienced musician from Denton has been playing music since he was seven years

old with his father. Prior to dedicating his musical talent to the Humanities of Nebraska, Marsh was a licensed mental health practitioner for 25 years at Lincoln Public Schools.

With over a dozen instruments and stories about each one, Marsh entertained the group and exposed a musical expose of the influence immigrants from around the world had on our American culture.

Marsh played music on the Autoharp, which developed from an instrument called the zither. A German immigrant invented the Autoharp at the end of the 19th century and the wooden instrument features 36

strings strung across the top of the body, similar to a guitar. He also played the hammered dulcimer, banjo, accordion, and bagpipes.

"Music From Around the World" is one of approximately 300 programs offered through the Humanities Nebraska Speakers Bureau. The more than 165 available speakers include acclaimed scholars, writers, musicians, storytellers and folklorists on topics ranging from pioneer heritage to ethics and law to international and multicultural issues, making it the largest humanities speakers' bureau in the nation.
