

I went skydiving.... at 89

What do you do when you have sky diving on your bucket list and been married for 70 years? For 89-year-old Bill Jividen of Stapleton it was easy. You go skydiving.

Bill's son, Donald Jividen said his dad had talked about jumping out of a plane several times. At his parent's 70th anniversary party he asked his dad if he was really serious. Bill said yes.

Donald, who has made three jumps, said 'then let's do it.'

Arrangements were made with 'Out of the Blue Skydiving' to join a sky diving group at a small airport at Limon, Colorado.

The Jividens were in the sixth group of the day and Bill was paired with "Dink," a USPA-rated tandem instructor who was with him through the entire process. After about 10 minutes of ground instruction, Bill was ready to make his first skydive.

He and Dink were strapped together with special parachute gear designed for two.

The plane ascended more than 12,000 feet in about eight minutes and Bill said that's when he was told to exit the plane and Bill bailed out.

"It's just a remarkable feeling in freefall," Bill said. "It blew my mind. There was absolutely no sound and I can't describe the experience of floating. It's the biggest thrill and if you like an adrenaline rush it's for you. But I would have to say it's not for everyone."

At about 5,000 feet the parachute is deployed and then you can sit back and relax and enjoy the scenery.

"Dink told me to hold my feet up and it was a gentle landing," Bill added.

Donald said he was a little concerned because his dad has a bad knee and after all he is 89, but he said it couldn't have gone any better.

Bill's philosophy in life is if you 'retire you rust out.' He sure doesn't have to worry about rust as he approaches his 90th birthday in October. He

stays busy every day and has been the grain cart driver at Wells Enterprises for the last 26 years. He has also mowed McCain Cemetery since 2011 Bill worked for Stoddard Well Drilling and was a licensed well driller for 14 years before retirement and worked for Barnum Well Repair for eight years. He plays music with his son, Kenny the last Sunday of the month at the Cornerstone Evangelical Presbyterian Church in Stapleton.

said with a big grin. "All I can say it was a thrill of a lifetime"

Active residential & agricultural market in Logan County

Logan County Assessor Debbie Myers mailed out notice of valuation changes for the 2023 tax year of real estate, improvements and improvements on leased lands in Logan County.

There was an active market for residential property in 2022. No changes to values were made with the exception of adding changes or additions that were made to the property.

Market studies are done on all Logan County residential properties, including mobile homes and acreages for a period of three years starting October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2022.

There were a total of 19 sales in the residential sales filed for 2022. The current level of residen-

tial property value approved by the Department of Revenue and Tax Equalization and Review Commission is 93%.

There was no change in value in commercial property unless new improvements or depreciation were changed. There was only one commercial sale in the three year sales period from October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2022. The current level of commercial property value as approved by the Department of Revenue and Tax Equalization and Review Commission is 100%.

Logan County agricultural land for the 2023 tax year saw a total of 26 qualified sales of unimproved agricultural land in the three-year study period from October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2022.

Out of the 26 sales, 15 were grassland, one dryland and 10 irrigated. Grassland, dryland and irrigated all increased an average of 4% across the board. The current level of agricultural property value approved by the Department of Revenue and Tax Equalization and Review Commission is 72%.

Taxpayers are reminded the amount of taxes required is determined by the budgeted needs requested by each Government Subdivision.

Taxing subdivisions within Logan County include Logan County, Stapleton Public Schools, Arnold Public Schools, Sandhills Public Schools, Stapleton, Dunning and Arnold Fire Districts, Educational Service Units #16 and #10, Mid-Plains Community College and Upper Loup NRD.
