Two special visitors made their way to Creative Printers last week to gather some Stapleton memorabilia.

Rob Seamans and son, Robert of New York City, made a tour of the village and took pictures of various points of interest including St. John's Catholic Church.

Seamans is the great-grandson of Daniel Casey Stapleton for whom the village was named. His mother is Stella Mae Renchard Seamans.

Daniel Casey and Stella (Hamilton) Stapleton had one daughter, Stelita Stapleton who married George Renchard. Stella is George and Stelita's daughter.

Seamans said he is the oldest of five children and currently is a professor at New York University conducting research on artificial intelligence.

The Stapletons continue to have land holdings in western Nebraska and Seaman said he also visited the Hayes County area.

As readers of *The Enterprise* know the village

was named after Daniel Casey Stapleton more than 100 years ago. Harry E. O'Neill, secretary-treasurer of the Loup Valley Land Company decided to honor Mr. Stapleton by naming the town after his personal friend.

Daniel C. Stapleton never lived in the village, nor did he frequent it. He is well-known for being from the upper society of Omaha, living in the jungles of South America and Washington, D.C. and even the court of the King of England.

Seamans was given the manuscript copy of "Who Was Dan Stapleton?" written by Larry Hardesty, a St. John's Catholic Church history book, Centennial postcards, and 2017 Total Solar Eclipse memorabilia.

Creative Printers received the following email from Rob Seamans on August 1, "It was a pleasure to meet you yesterday. Thank you for sharing the PDF of the Dan Stapleton manuscript. The summer months have been busy ones at Stapleton Public Schools. Several rooms were renovated and the front steps were reconstructed to make them compliant. New flooring was installed in several rooms and distance learning was moved to the third floor. The sixth grade will now be on the second floor by the fourth and fifth grade rooms. A sidewalk was also poured on the south side of the school to the shop building.

The first day of school for students will be August 16. Teachers will be back in the building on August 11. An open house will be held Thursday, August 17 at 6:00 p.m. You may tour the school and meet with teachers. A coaches meeting will follow the open house. Stapleton Schools Booster Club will be providing a free meal in the school lobby to help welcome everyone back for the new school year.

Several new faces will be walking the halls this year and include:

Jeremiah Johnson will be the new secondary principal and athletic director. Mr. Johnson served as an English Language Arts teacher for the

last eight years prior to becoming an administrator. He has been at Cedar Bluffs Public Schools the last four years and before arriving at Cedar Bluffs he taught English at Elba Public Schools and Princeton High School in Princeton, California. He has also coached a variety of sports at multiple levels.

Mr. Johnson spent six and a half years serving in the U.S. Air Force and has also worked four years for the National Park Service.

He has moved into a house in Stapleton and has a 14-year-old daughter Kasi who will be a freshman at Papillion LaVista South High School this fall.

Bobbi Isom will be the new elementary principal and curriculum specialist for the 2023-24 school year. Mrs. Isom substituted for Mr. Hynes at Stapleton Public Schools while he was deployed. She was the middle school principal at Madison for two years and has been in education for 35 years. She taught history for 25 years in North Platte middle schools and elementary special education in Southern California.

Mrs. Isom came out of retirement because she missed teaching and is excited and looking forward to her new position at Stapleton Public

Holdrege alumni, Mrs. Megan Jones will be the new sixth grade teacher. She taught five years at St. Stephen the Martyr Catholic School in Omaha and recently moved to an acreage north of North Platte.

Miss Gentry Barner, an alumni of McPherson County High School and a graduate of the University of Nebraska at Kearney, is a first year teacher.

She will be the new Kindergarten teacher.

The new physical education teacher is Mr. Josh Deines. He taught 10 years at Sandhills Public Schools and lives in Arnold.

Klara Dailey of Stapleton is the new officer manager and Cherie Kramer is a new para-educator and she will assist with junior high volleyball.

of Stapleton, driver of the Suburban and her passenger were taken to Great Plains Health where they were treated and released. The 14-year-old tractor driver was not injured. Stapleton and North Platte Fire & Rescue were on scene.

The Suburban was estimated as a total loss. The tractor sustained significant damage to the front tire and axle.
