## UNL Extension Funding Launches Little Free Food Pantry In Thedford

The USDA estimates that 10.5% of Americans experienced food insecurity, had trouble accessing enough nutritionally adequate food for their household, in 2020. Among households with children, 14.8% of households experienced food insecurity. Thanks to a grant through the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Extension, Little Free Pantries are being installed across the state to further combat food insecurity.

Your support is key in addressing food insecurity in the Thedford area.

Little Free Pantries are a new movement similar to Little Free Libraries and function in a similar way.

They are small boxes set up in the community where citizens in need can access free food and those who are able can donate food items. While many food pantries have hours of operation and information requirements to access food, Little Free Pantries offer anonymous access to food whenever it is needed allowing them to reach more community members.

The Sandhills Leadership Youth of 2022-2023 from Thedford High School helped build the box and secure placement in partnership with Jay Jones and the Thedford Area Community Foundation and Thed-

ford Service Club. The box is located next to Security First Bank in the Masonic Lodge lot. Sandhills Leadership will continue to stock/monitor the contents of the box in the upcoming school years, but we invite community partners to participate, particularly in the summer months.

UNL will have funds to stock the pantry for two months (starting in August 2023). After that,

## Fiber Network Upgrades Coming To The Area

Consolidated Companies, Inc. has kicked off construction on fiber network upgrades in several Nebraska locations. The fiber-to-the-premises technology provides phone service and internet service at speeds up to 1 Gigabit. "We're excited to be the longtime provider in these communities and build the technology infrastructure of the future," said Consolidated Plant Manager, Ryan Pate. "Fiber-optic networks are fast and reliable, allowing businesses and residents alike to connect to the re-

sources they need to grow their businesses and enjoy streaming entertainment and educational opportunities online."

Consolidated's 2023 construction budget is expected to exceed \$6 Million and will reach approximately 900 customer locations. With matching funds from the Nebraska Broadband Bridge Grant program managed by the Nebraska Public Service Commission, the Lincoln-based company recently completed fiber to customers in Hyannis,

Mullen, and Eustis. During 2023 additional town and rural projects will enhance Consolidated's ongoing network upgrades in Arthur, Blaine, Dawson, Frontier, Grant, Hooker, and Thomas counties.

In the coming months, residents of Arthur, Brewster, Dunning, Halsey, and Stockville will see Consolidated's contractors and construction teams working in utility easement areas. Services will become available to residents gradually as the network is completed.

Coy Johnston returned to the High School National Finals Rodeo in Gillette, Wyoming to defend his 2022 National High School Champion steer wrestling title. Johnston, a May graduate of Stapleton High School, went into the first round of the 75th finals July 16-22 and took his steer down in 4.65 seconds and ended the first go with a fourth place finish. In the second go, Johnston wrestled his steer in 5.88 seconds and ended the tough go-around in 28th place. Coy went into the finals and had a quick 4.99 run and placed sixth. His average time was good enough for him to end his high school career with a third place buckle and a total on three head of 15.52, just three seconds shy of the top spot, which was won by Peter Haas of Neola, Utah with a time of 12.75 seconds.
