

No, it wasn't a crash landing

A plane landing in Kimber's parking lot Tuesday morning, February 4, caused quite a bit of excitement in the Village of Stapleton. It's not every day you see a pilot making a landing like this, and no - it wasn't an emergency.

"It was snowing in Arthur and it was getting a little cold in my plane," Jeff Daly said. "I decided I'd just stop in and get some food and warm up a bit."

Daly said it really isn't a big deal to take off and land in his Badlands Traveler. Although it doesn't have a heater, the super cub has taken him to 37 states. He ended up third in the nation in the National STOL (Short Take-off & Landing) competition last year.

STOL is a competitive series designed for pilots across the nation to demonstrate their prowess in a sport-oriented environment.

Pilots compete in one or more events throughout the year, accumulating points towards an annual National Title for top performers. While proficiency in short takeoffs and landings is typically associated with bush pi-

lots navigating backcountry terrain, it is a skill that all aviators can and should refine.

Daly said he makes 15' take-offs and 16' landings and has been competing in STOL two years and

flying for seven.

He is the son of Rod and Gail Daly of Paxton and the grandson of LeRoy and the late Donna Daly. Jeff and his wife, Raelynn, live near the Arthur airport runway.

New officers were recently elected at the annual meeting of the Logan County Ag Society. Kristopher Norem will continue as president; Scott Salisbury, vice president; Bethany Deardoff, secretary; and Casey Connell, treasurer. Members are Sean Carson, Erin Frey, Leo Harwager, Toby Kinderknecht, Chelsey Myers and Logan Hill. The 2025 fair dates are July 28 through August 3.

The Ag Society is the recipient of a Mid-Nebraska Community Foundation Betterment grant in the amount of \$5,000. This will be used to purchase 240 new folding chairs for the fair building.

Betterment grants are awarded to projects that benefit people and qualified 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations and to qualified public government organizations or agencies.

Betterment grants fund facility improvements, equipment, technology,

vehicles, repairs, community events, safety, new services, training, community facilities, data systems, community disasters, beautification, shelter, new programs, assessments and planning. Grant awards last year ranged from \$500 to \$50,000 and are awarded four times per year.

The Ag Society is advertising the blue folding chairs in a bid notice in this issue of *The Enterprise*. Chairs are being sold in bundles of four. Bids may be submitted to Logan County Ag Society, P.O. Box 173, Stapleton, NE 69163.

Donation letters will soon be in the mail for the Logan County Fair & Rodeo activities that have been conducted for the past 113 years. Donations should be submitted by May 1, or as soon as possible.
